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4. Child and Adolescent Mental Health Division (CAMHD) Legislative Updates	<ul> <li>Dr. Michels gave the following updates:</li> <li>Requested funding for rate increase for the Purchase of Service (POS) providers.</li> <li>Met with the POS providers to find out what areas of levels of care that needed support and additional funding.</li> <li>A request was submitted to the Governor's Office for: Therapeutic Foster Program and Community Based Residential Program. The funding was 15% for the first year and 5% for the second year.</li> <li>The request was accepted by the Governor's Office and is awaiting approval from Budget and Finance.</li> <li>CAMHD has been active in moving youth to lower levels of care due to better oversight and resources. The number of youth has increased and the length of stays has decreased.</li> <li>CAMHD has been awarded a grant which will enable them to bring back most of the youth from the mainland.</li> <li>Ms. Simms motioned for the Council to write testimony in support of the rate increase for POS. Mr. Rocchio seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.</li> </ul>	Action: Chair has volunteered to write testimony in support of CAMHD's budget effort for HB100.	S. Michels, M.D.	
5. Adult Mental Health Division (AMHD) Legislative Updates	<ul> <li>Dr. Fridovich gave the following updates:</li> <li>Both Senate Bills 202 and 203 for the Service Area Board and the State Council on Mental were heard in the Senate and crossed over to the House.</li> <li>HB554 and SB146, Psychiatric Treatment – Permits an administrative order to overcome a patient's objection to psychiatric treatment. HB554 hearing is tomorrow (3/15/17). Queen's Medical Center requested to modify the bill to include Family Court to decide treatment.</li> <li>HB556 and SB148, Repeals the requirement that all applicants for health and human services procurement contracts possess all licenses necessary to conduct the subject business. Both bills have been supported.</li> <li>HB553, Criminal Defendants; Fitness to Proceed; Examinations – Provides that the court may appoint one (1) qualified examiner, rather than three (3) to evaluate a criminal defendant's fitness to proceed in a felony case.</li> </ul>	For information, only. 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	<ul> <li>SB145 – AMHD is in support of this bill.</li> <li>Ms. Simms motioned that the Council submit testimony in support of HB554 when it comes up for hearing in the Judiciary and Labor Committee. Dr. Vorsino seconded. Motion passed unanimously.</li> <li>Dr. Ries motioned that the Council submit testimony in support of HB556. Ms. Simms seconded. Motion passed unanimously.</li> </ul>	Action: Dr. Vorsino to write testimony on behalf of the Council for HB554 and HB556.		
6. State Council on Mental Health Legislative Updates	<ul> <li>Senate Bill 202 and 203 are being submitted to the Judiciary Committee.</li> <li>SB202 amends statutory provisions relating to quorum and voting requirements for service area boards on mental health and substance abuse within the department of health for administrative purposes.</li> <li>SB203 amends the membership of the State Council on Mental Health, defines quorum for the Council, and specifies number of votes required to constitute valid acts of the Council.</li> <li>Dr. Dang motioned that the Council to submit testimony in support of SB202 and 203 when both bills come up in the Judiciary Committee; Ms. Crum seconded. Motion passed unanimously.</li> <li>Dr. Vorsino suggested having a Permitted Interaction Group in December 2017, so that the Council will be able to track bills for the next legislative session and give the Council the opportunity to advocate, support, and give testimony on certain mental health bills.</li> </ul>	For information, only.
