6. Report on the 2016 National Block Grant Conference	 Since the Chair of the Council retired earlier this year, Dr. Vorsino, as the 1st Vice Chair, has been chairing the Council meetings. As a result, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) invited Dr. Vorsino to attend the conference which was held in Washington D.C. on August 9-11. Members discussed updates on the transition of Maui Memorial to Kaiser, which Ms. Tom noted will be delayed until 2017.
