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4. Adult Mental Health Division (AMHD) Report	 Dr. Fridovich gave a power point presentation on AMHD activities/updates. AMHD Rebuilding Community Mental Health Capacity: Stabilizing Community Supports Redesigned Crisis Line Hawaii Increased funding for Crises Mobile Outreach Increased funding for Crisis Stabilization Management Court Evaluation Branch is fully staffed Finalized the re-organization, and fully staffed the Community Mental Health Centers Long Term Care facility on the Hawaii State Hospital (HSH) grounds. Memorandum of Understanding with the Department of Human Services (DHS) is complete. Avalon Health Care is coordinating the HSH project along with the Department of Accounting and General Services. AMHD is issuing a Request For Proposal (RFP) for secured residential services to expand existing service lines for the Special Residential program. Intensive Case Management (ICM) Pilot project is focused on diversion from HSH and jail. Homeless ICM project - SMI adults on Oahu, homeless, and many with co-occurring substances use challenges. Approximately 1100 full time equivalent (FTE) positions are allocated for AMHD. Legislative Update: AMHD has no legislative bills for this legislation session. AMHD will support the bills for the State Council (quorum issues) should they come up this session. AMHD is working on updating its Hawaii Administrative Rules. Dr. Vorsino requested that Dr. Fridovich attend a Council meeting to update the Council on any AMHD legislative bills it might submit, so that the Council can prepare to give testimony of support. 	Ms. Nagao commented that there is a need for attention to mental health in rural areas. She explained that resources are limited and there is a great need for services on the Neighbor Islands.			
	In order to be more proactive this legislative session, it was suggested to have a list of Council members and Service Area Board members who could give testimony on mental health issues on short notice. After much discussion, Dr. Ries motioned that Ms. Jackson chair the Legislative Permitted Interaction Group for the 2018 legislative session. Ms. Kahahane seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Solve system problems Update/Communicate by sharing information, establish mechanisms to ensure linkage between staff, networking, and multi-agency engagement. Youth Specific Problem Solving Policy Recommendations Dr. Michels noted that the resolution for HI-SYNC will be introduced this Legislative Session. Other updates for CAMHD: November 13, 2017 was the closing date to submit RFP for Residential Placement/Community Base Residential. The purpose for the RFP is to implement community base residential. Kaeru Services (to return home) – new SAMSHA program. To reduce the number of incarcerated youth who are being sent to the mainland to get services, but instead to bring them back home so they can get services here. WRAP around services will be implemented to avoid youth from being sent to the mainland.

	Dr. Vorsino suggested that before adding addiction, detox services, along with co-occurring disorders, and the other items mentioned, that the Council should think about the trends/identifying problems before they are added to the Strategic Plan.			
	Mr. Rocchio suggested looking at HACDACS' Strategic Plan and partner with them.			
	Dr. Dang commented to also add homelessness to the Council's Strategic Plan. She suggested adding these new ideas to the strategic plan and take a vote to prioritize the top five items; then the Council could work on one issue at a time until completed. She opined that the Council needs to narrow its focus so that something is accomplished.	Action:
