4. Island Reports	 Kaua`i Island Ms. Sandal reported on the following: Ms. Gina Kaulukukui shared information on Suicide Services with the Kaua`i Service Area Board (KSAB). There were 16 suicides on Kaua`i last year and 12% of Kaua`i teens have planned suicides. The Mental Health Transformation Grant had planned to train members of the Kaua`i Police Department about a year ago, but due to the change in leadership, the access to funds have not occurred. 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	 Dr. Keith Claypool presented information on the Forensic programs on Kaua`i. There is still a need for a Licensed Crisis Residential (LCRS) program. 			
	 Hawai'i Island Mr. Holschuh, the new Hawaii Service Area Board (HSAB) representative on the State Council, reported on the following: The Hawaii Service Area Board (HSAB) has six (6) members with three (3) vacancies. The HSAB is seeking members to represent the Adolescent and the Veteran's Administration populations. From October 23rd – 28th, 2011, the East Hawaii Homeless Initiative, Project Hope in Hilo, used the 100K Home model, which is a campaign to find permanent homes for the most vulnerable individuals/homeless individuals. These individuals are at a higher risk of dying on the streets because of mental illness, health challenges, etc. Based on a survey of these individuals the Vulnerability Index showed that 30% were found to be vulnerable based on health conditions and other indicators associated with high mortality risks; 39% reported having dual diagnosis, mental illness and substance abuse issues; 15% were veterans and 24% reported a history of involvement with foster care. 	 Maui County Mr. Gonzalez reported that the Maui Service Area Board (MSAB) did not meet because Molokai video-conferencing was experiencing technical difficulties. At the last MSAB meeting there was good discussion on suicide prevention activities due to the rise in suicides in the County. Funds are unavailable for the Forensic Programs; however, the County is waiting for monies to investigate the possibilities for a Jail Diversion program. 	For information only.

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5. AMHD Report	 Dr. Sheehan shared the following information: The Community Based Case Management (CBCM) procurement has been completed. Received 10-11 proposal responses from providers and these have been reviewed and scored. Approximately 4,000 eligible consumers, which include consumers with QEXA insurance, will receive CBCM services. NAMI will be publishing a report on mental health expenditure cuts nation-wide. Will discuss this report at the next meeting. The Director of Health is working on the Strategic Plan for the Department of Health and it will be posted shortly. AMHD will be working on its Strategic Plan and a draft will be shared with the Council for input. System Improvement Project Update – A contract has been signed with the eCURA Company that will allow AMHD to test HIPAA 5010. HIPAA 5010 is needed to be in compliance for billing with the Federal government effective January 1, 2012. The Consumer Satisfaction Survey has been completed. This was caused by not enough individuals available for the program for it to be cost effective. Dr. Sheehan will ask Mr. Steve Balcom, AMHD Crisis Services Director, to re-evaluate the need for a LCRS-type program on Kaua`i. CAMHD Report	 Dr. Michels reported on the following: There will be an organizational meeting in Washington, D.C. in December regarding the SAMHSA Planning Grant concerning youth with developmental delays and behavioral problems. Individuals involved in this meeting along with SAMHSA administrations include: the Director of the Project, a representative from Developmental Disabilities Division, Hawaii Families as Allies and from the Department of Education (DOE). This will be a working meeting to start building relationships and to discuss strategies, policies and program development across agencies. The re-organization process for CAMHD has moved into the active phase Goals of the process are: Better delineation of clinical services versus administrative people. Accountability between clinicians and more senior clinicians on day-to day care of youth. Decrease the number of Sections and Branches to decrease the silo effect. This will produce more collaboration among teams. Efforts are progressing on billing comprehensively. CAMHD is working to increase MedQUEST reimbursement codes and recover cost from private insurers. CAMHD has hired or is in the process of hiring the following staff: Clinical Director for the Big Island in Hilo. Clinical Director for the Honolulu Family Guidance Center. Full-time Psychiatrist who will oversee the Tele-Health Program. Active recruitment for Branch Chiefs at the Leeward Family Guidance Center and the Family Court Liaison Branch (FCLB). In an effort to work more closely with the Office of Youth Services (OYS and the Hawaii Youth Correctional Facility (HYCF), the FCLB will move into the main complex closer to the Education program. Council members raised several issues: Bullying in schools appears to start at the elementary school level, where some children are getting away with this behavior and not being treated psychologically, while other children are being abused. Is CAMHD collaborating with the DOE to address this issue? What about cyber-bullying, which is a community concern, and many times result in suicides. Is CAMHD involved with that? What is the population at HYCF and the number that CAMHD is involved with?	e /CONCLUSIONS		

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	 Dr. Michels responded that he was recently involved in a bullying problem that became a safety issue. He opined that this social issue is a huge concern that needs broader discussions with the DOE, Early Intervention from the Family Health Service Administration and other agencies. Cyber-bullying straddles both education and mental health. Law Enforcement has taken the lead on that, not CAMHD. 60-70% of youth at HYCF have some type of behavioral challenges. The census at HYCF has decreased due in part to the efforts of OYS and the Juvenile Justice Department. The criteria, diagnostic categories and manifestations of some disorders for CAMHD and AMHD are quite different. Only 2% of youth from CAMHD are found eligible for AMHD services Dr. Sheehan noted that he is interested in collecting data on this group of youth who received services at CAMHD, but initially was not found eligible for AMHD services then later received services from AMHD. Council members offered the following: Collect data on recently eligible adults, age 20-25 years. Check to see if they previously received CAMHD services and their diagnoses while at CAMHD Review these eligible adults' current diagnoses compared with their previous diagnoses. Use Block Grant to fund the project. Collect data from Mental Health Court on these individuals. 	Resolution Council members will continue to monitor and discuss the transition of youth to adults; adults to geriatrics – the transition through the life spans for individuals receiving mental health services.		
7. Discussion on Draft 2010 Report to the Governor and Legislature	 At 11:00 a.m. the Maui video-conferencing site was disconnected without anyone's knowledge. Once re-connected, Ms. Hansen expressed her dissatisfaction that Council members continued their discussion on the draft Report without her input. Members stated that they were not aware of the disconnection and that the discussion was only to clarify the process and purpose of the Report for new members. No member had stated objections to the Report. Ms. Sandal motioned to adopt the Report to the Governor and the Legislature. Judge Simms seconded the motion.
