Technical difficulty. In the event that the audiovisual communication cannot be maintained by all participating Council members and quorum is lost, the meeting will be automatically recessed for up to thirty minutes, during which time, an attempt to restore audiovisual communication will be made. If the Council is able to re-establish audio communication only, the meeting will be reconvened and continue. If the Council is unable to reconvene the meeting because neither audiovisual communication nor audio communication can be re-established within thirty minutes, the meeting will automatically be terminated.
