- DCCA -presentation on the implementation of HB1380. This to the Committee only.
- DHRD on behavioral health jobseekers (volume, filled, vacancies, time span and others). Staff will look at DHRD reports on how they report data, take up the DHRD presentation with committee members for more exact "ask" language. Also, SCMH ex-officio member Marian Tsuji will be update of this request.

-Relating to workforce development, the Committee was made aware of a new public health workforce lab at UH. <u>Hawai'i PH Workforce</u> <u>Catalyst Lab | Office of Public Health Studies (hawaii.edu)</u>

AMHD (Erin Snyder) on Supportive Housing
 -Relating to this topic, the committee learned that the Council will be alerted that a nonprofit in West Oahu, that provides group homes

services, is ending its operations this month. Consumers have 45 days notice and there is a problem about where they will be placed. -Like other group homes that might also end up closing, the issue is rates/financial viability. For this particular case, staff shortage does not appear to be the problem.

-The Council can see the situation in two ways- 1) urgent need -a need to respond to this emergency, and 2) long-term problem of shortage.
